The university and the city

The University of Luxembourg was established on 12 August 2003. As a new university it responds to the needs of Luxembourg within the dynamic European context. Its unique multilingual, interdisciplinary and international character reflects the country's global affairs, including democratisation and human rights.

In practice, students at the University of Luxembourg can choose from a range of courses which include a dozen academic or professional Bachelors degree courses, more than 30 academic or professional Masters degree courses and several doctoral schools, all of which run completely in line with the Bologna system, as well as several special courses.

The former 'Gibraltar of the North', the city of Luxembourg symbolises the process of political integration on the continent as it was successfully transformed from a military fortress into a dynamic capital of Europe hosting numerous European institutions, such as the European Court of Justice or the European Investment Bank.
