The University and the City

Thessaloniki is the second largest city in Greece, with a lively and interesting present and a long and important past. The city was established in 316 B.C. The modern city is a crossroad of peoples from all over the world, lively and bustling with life. Places to visit: The Palace of Galerius, The Roman Market and Theatre, the Roman Baths, Byzantine Churches, the Archaeological and Byzantine Museums etc.

The **Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (A.U.Th.)**, founded in 1925, is the largest University of South-Eastern Europe. It has 11 Faculties, 41 Schools, approximately 65.026 undergraduate students, 8.472 postgraduate students and more than 2.000 members of the A.U.Th. teaching and research staff, which makes Thessaloniki a real student city. The A.U.Th. is situated only a few minutes from the city centre. The academic year runs from October till May (June and September are examination periods).

Founded in 1997, the **UNESCO Chair on Education for Human Rights, Democracy and Peace** is part of the UNITWIN/ UNESCO Chairs Programme. It focuses its activities on introducing and promoting in the University, as well as in primary and secondary education curricula, the concepts of human rights and peace.
