## The university and the city

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One of the main aims of the Faculty of Law of the University of Zagreb is to foster excellence through international cooperation. Through agreements with more than 130 institutions of higher education throughout Europe and other continents, we offer a warm welcome to all our student guests from abroad. Every year more and more foreign students come to Zagreb to follow our courses and thus form the international environment at our Faculty. We are open to establishing new partnerships and projects in our exchange programmes.

Zagreb is the largest, most influential, and culturally significant city in Croatia. Resting on the southern slopes of the Medvednica mountain, along the Sava river, it has a population of over one million. Central European in appearance and spirit, Zagreb bears the hallmark of centuries spent under the Habsburg rule with an impressive beauty of its own. The cobblestone streets and the various architectural wonders blend beautifully with city's fantastic outdoor spaces such as Maksimir Park, Mirogoj or Jarun Lake. Sljeme, the highest peak of Medvednica range, is easily accessible from the city and sports activities here include hiking, skiing and many more, depending on the season. Medvedgrad, the medieval castle, looms above the city for an appealing medley of the contemporary and ancient. With its plethora of museums, restaurants and a lively nightlife, Zagreb is becoming an ideal destination for visitors who come to see the historic town and take advantage of the relative cheapness of a European city. Its location and good traffic relations with other neighbouring capital cities make it a perfect starting point for exploring the beautiful Adriatic coastline and many other nearby attractions.
